Child Care Information

Kids Korner, located near the front doors of BWC is specifically for children 6 months - 5 years of age. Kids Zone is a fun place for older children, ages 6 - 11 years. They can play games, tumble on the mats, and participate in other fun activities.

PLEASE NOTE: Maximum stay per visit is 2 hours and 15 minutes

Important Information

> During the school year, Kids Zone is not open on weekdays from 8:00A- 12:00P, unless school is closed on a scheduled break or holiday. Bradley Wellness Center follows Whitfield County and Dalton Public Schools calendar.

- > Leak-Proof Sippy Cups and water bottles are welcome.
- > If your child is potty training, let us know and also bring in an extra pair of training pants or a pull-up.
- > Please send extra clothes and diapers for your child.
- > Do not bring toys from home. BWC is not responsible for loss/damage.
- > Children with fever, cough, vomiting, or diarrhea are not able to be placed into childcare. Please refer to the BWC Sick Policy

Children are welcome back after they have been fever free for 24 hours. If your child has a runny nose with green/yellow mucus, you will need to wait until it becomes clear for your child to stay. Children with lice are not allowed into childcare until the lice have been treated and the child has gone 24 hours post-treatment. If we suspect a fever, a temperature will be taken under the arm. It is important that we know where the parent/guardian is within the building for emergency purposes.

Children's Policy

- > Children 12 years or older must have a membership.
- > Dependent children younger than 12 years who are visiting the BWC with a parent/guardian member MUST be checked in at the Front
- Desk. A consent form MUST be signed and kept on file.
- > Each adult member will be limited to one non-dependent child under 12 years old per visit at no charge. Additional non-dependent children under 12 years will be charged \$5 per visit.
- > All non-dependent children under 12 visiting with a member or non-member will be required to pay \$5 per visit. Those who are 12 and older will pay \$10 per visit.
- > A parent or adult member must accompany non-members under the age of 18 while using the facility: parental consent is required.
- > Members under 18 can NOT bring children and quests without adult supervision.
- > During Kids Korner and Kids Zone hours, children may not be in the basketball arena or on the fitness floor.
- > When Kids Korner and/or Kids Zone are closed, children must stay with parents at all times. Children are not allowed to use free weights or circuit weight equipment.
- > Children are not allowed free play in the pool or ramp when scheduled classes are in session.
- > Children under the age of three or not potty-trained, BY LAW, must wear specially designed swim diapers while in the pool.

Sick Policy

Bradley Wellness Center Child Care reserves the right to temporarily deny any child admittance for reasons of obvious illness or respiratory symptoms or to request early departure should symptoms becomes apparent during the course of the stay. This is to ensure the continued good health of everyone at the center. We realize that children will have allergies and we do try to accommodate as much as possible. However, for the health and wellbeing of the children in our care and our staff we feel it is vital to maintain a strict wellness policy. We ask for parents to assist by keeping sick children at home.

When a child may not attend Bradley Wellness Center Child Care:

Fever: Children with a temperature of 100.0 or higher are not permitted into child care. Children must be free of fever (any temperature above 98.6 degrees) for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication to return to Child Care.

Rash: Such as Hand, Foot, & Mouth Disease. This does not apply to a common diaper rash or minor skin irritation.

Conjunctivitis (pink eye): Children are not permitted if there appears to be an unusual amount of discharge from or irritation to their eye(s). If the diagnosis is BACTERIAL CONJUNCTIVITIS children must have received at least 24 hours of treatment. If the diagnosis is VIRAL CONJUNCTIVITIS your child may stay AS LONG AS THERE IS NO DISCHARGE.

Thick White, Green or Yellow Nasal Discharge: Children will not be permitted if they appear to have any thick white, green or yellow nasal discharge. This is often indicative of an infection and out of an abundance of caution your child will not be allowed back into child care until the discharge has cleared.

child care until the discharge has cleared. Diarrhea/Vomiting: Children who vomit or have three or more loose bowel movements in the time they are in child care will not be per-

mitted to stay. Parents will be found by staff and informed of the illness. Persistent Hacking Cough: Children will not be permitted if they have a persistent hacking cough.

Lice: Children will not be readmitted until 24 hours after treatment and must be nit free.

Common Cold Policy

Children suffering from a common cold will be assessed on an individual basis.

Factors of consideration include the developmental level of your child in congruence with our ability to limit the spread of germs. The younger your child, the more difficult it is to keep the spread of germs down. For example: hand to face contact, mouthing of toys, uncontrolled nasal discharge, uncovered sneezing and coughing etc.
